

ST. NICHOLAS MADE FROM A PAPER TUBE

MATERIALS:

Half a paper towel tube (cut piece = 5 1/2 inches long)
Purple, white, and pink artists acrylic Liquitex tube paint
7-inch metallic gold chenille stem or pipe cleaner
Yellow construction paper
Cotton
White poster board or cardstock
(pattern may be printed or copied on cardstock)
Craft glue
Black fine-point marker

EQUIPMENT:

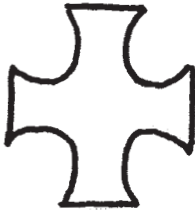
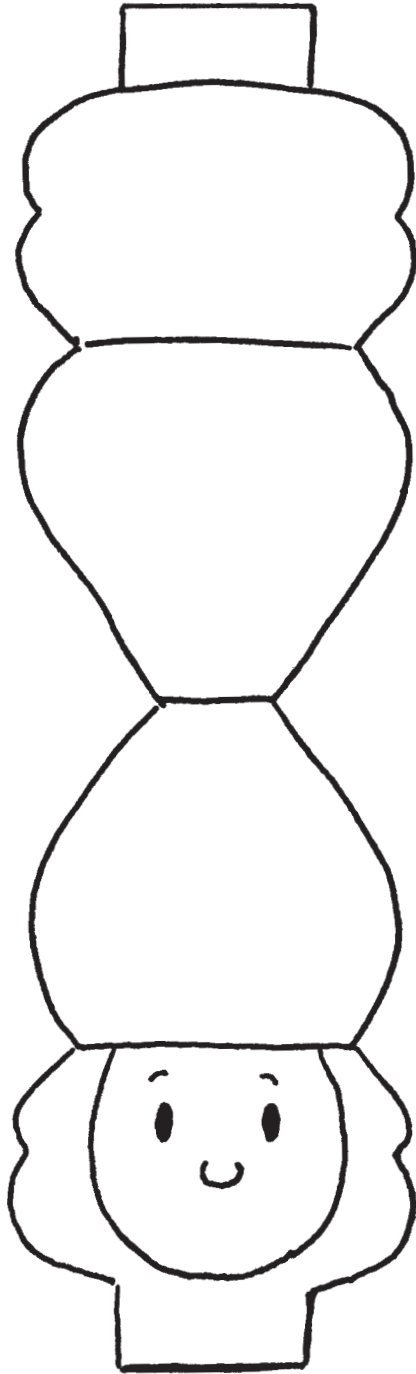
Scissors
Paint brushes

DIRECTIONS:

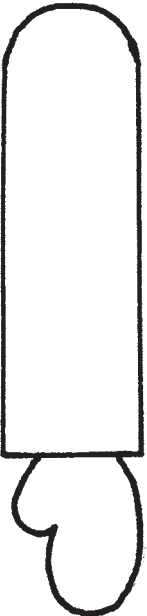
1. Paint paper tube purple and set aside to dry.
2. Cut arms and head out of poster board or cardstock.
3. (a) Paint underside of head and top side of miter (bishop's hat) purple. Let dry.
(b) Paint face area pink. Let dry.
(c) Paint hair white. Let dry.
(d) Paint arms purple and hands pink. Let dry.
4. Draw eyes and nose with black marker.
5. Glue back head tab to inside back of tube. Then glue front head tab to inside of front of tube.
6. Cut cross out of yellow construction paper and paste on the front of miter.
7. Glue on cotton beard (see picture).
8. Bend metallic gold chenille stem or pipe cleaner into a crozier (staff) by making a crook on one end.
9. Glue on arms, with hands meeting in the front below beard; place crozier under hands as the arms are glued on. Let dry.
